Foreword

by Brian Porteous

Can it already be two years since we met in General Assembly in Italy? How time flies! It has been a continuing privilege for me to be your President over these past two years and it is my honour now to present this Biennial Report on behalf of the IOF Council.

As you will be aware, one of the major things to happen during the last two years to which this report refers has been the major changes in the IOF Office and our professional team. Barbro Ronnberg retired at the end of 2014 after 18 years of outstanding service to the sport of orienteering and I want to start these remarks by paying tribute to that service. Barbro contributed hugely to the globalisation of the sport and also to building a platform of recognition for us within many of the world's multi-sport organisations including the International Olympic Committee. We owe Barbro and the various staff members who supported her over the time the office was in Helsinki, a great debt of gratitude.

Barbro's retirement gave us the chance to think afresh about the type of professional support we needed to go forward and the Council was delighted to be able to appoint Tom Hollowell to the post of Secretary General and Chief Executive in January 2015. Tom has now had the chance to build his own team based in Karlstad, Sweden where the IOF has relocated. The new team has a particular focus on marketing with key commercial and broadcasting objectives linked to a continuing emphasis on growing the global footprint of orienteering around the world and we are looking forward to see exciting results from the work of this talented team in the months to come.

In terms of our global reach, we have continued to grow and we were especially delighted to welcome Egypt as our 80th member in 2015. The Council

has been reviewing the membership list to remove countries where there is no activity or where membership fees have remained unpaid for a number of years to ensure that when we claim to have members, we have active ones and not just flags. This is an approach welcomed by the International Olympic Committee. In the short term this will mean us reporting a slight reduction in members but we know that there are a number of active countries getting ready to apply for membership and we expect any reduction only to be short term.

TV continues to be a vital way of promoting our sport and in the last two years we have seen continued development of the quality of our World Championships TV coverage in Italy and then in the UK. The quality of our TV product means that we are now able to sell the packages to a much wider market as well to provide a professional streaming service. We are optimistic that packages of various lengths will be available in some 90 territories around the world when we broadcast from Sweden this year. Continued progress has also been made in the televising of other levels of competitions and in our other disciplines. With more extensive TV coverage, we have also seen the start of the growth of our commercial income and I want to record my particular thanks to Nokian Tyres for their sponsorship of the World Orienteering Championships.


We are on a journey, an Olympic journey, and all the work we are doing to grow the sport around the world and to expand the reach of our TV coverage is being noticed. As I meet with representatives of the many international sports organisation, there is a growing recognition of the fact that, winter and summer, we are now a big world sport. In my personal view, we are a big world sport now worthy of inclusion in the Olympic Games and that continues to be the focus of the

Strategic Directions of the IOF. I sense we are getting towards a tipping point where we will find the journey becomes easier but we all, nationally and internationally, need to continue to work towards that goal. The implementation of the IOC's Agenda 2020 is giving us particular cause to feel positive about the Olympic journey and our partnership with the IOC is vital if we are to be successful.

One further way of securing the attention of the sporting world is by our participation in multi-sport events. We are looking forward to the next edition of the World Games in Wroclaw, Poland in 2017 and the 2017 World Masters Games in Auckland, New Zealand. In February of this year the International University Sports Federation FISU stage the first ever World University Ski Orienteering Championships in Tula, Russia. This competition was a major success due to the commitment of many including the Russian Orienteering Federation and has given us a strong platform to build towards the Winter Universiade in 2019 in Krasnoyarsk, Russia.

In terms of 'domestic' matters, I want to pay tribute to all, in Council, Commissions and Federations who have contributed to our major events review. This has been a complex task and one which has required detailed consideration and consultation. While, as orienteers, we will always be looking for new and better ways of doing things, my hope is that, following the review and the discussions we will have in the General Assembly, we will be able to move forward with a reasonable consensus around a stable programme for the future.

As I write this foreword, we have just finished the analysis of the outstandingly successful first World Orienteering Day (WOD) on 11 May 2016. The initiative supported by a letter from IOC President Thomas Bach and has shown in no uncertain terms just how global our sport is. WOD with



people taking part in our sport from Russia to Chile, form New Zealand to Greenland and most places in between. We were on every continent except Antarctica (where it is deepest winter!) A total of 81 countries and territories were involved in staging 2013 individual events with a world record participation of 252,927 individuals. I am so grateful to the many clubs, schools and other organisations which responded to this opportunity. It will make many around the world sit up and notice orienteering – a sport for the whole world.

As I come to the end of this foreword and indeed, my time in senior positions within the IOF, I must say how great an honour it has been to be your President. However, I am conscious that I have been so lucky to be supported and encouraged by so many hard working people and I want to thank them here – to our professional teams led firstly Barbro and now Tom I say thanks for your expertise and for working way beyond what we can reasonably expect; to my fellow Council members I say thanks for being a great and enthusiastic team; to our Commission Chairs and members, thanks for your expertise and hard work; to our Regional Development team, thanks for making us a growing global sport; to all federations I say thanks for your commitment to major IOF events and to the growth of the sport in your own countries and finally, I say thanks to all the members of our sporting family for their enthusiasm and participation in the greatest sport in the world.

Continuing along the strategic path 2012–2018

During the 2014–2016 Congress Period steps have continued towards fulfilling the Strategic Directions 2012–2018 which were endorsed at the IOF Ordinary General Assembly in 2012. Particular focus has been put on strengthening regional development efforts, making the sport of orienteering more attractive to young people and on renewing the professional organisational structure of the IOF with the aim of gaining further external funding through the efforts for increased visibility. Furthermore, efforts have been made to strengthen the IOFs position on the world sporting stage through cooperation and communications efforts.



The vision of the IOF remains that orienteering shall be a truly global sport and included in the Olympic and Paralympic Games.

The strategic initiatives and actions for the strategic period are:

- Focus on key outcomes
- Increase the attractiveness of orienteering to young people
- Strengthen the IOF's position on the world sporting stage
- Increase the visibility of orienteering
- Strong management and funding

The implementation of the strategy is steered by Activity Plans prepared for each two-year Congress period. Each Council member has been given a responsibility area in the Activity Plan. To supplement the Activity Plans, specific commission remits have been developed by the Council in consultation with the respective commissions.

A new commission for Regional and Youth Development

During 2015 a new commission was started focusing on regional and youth development issues (Regional and Youth Development Commission – RYDC). The commission has taken on the leadership of initiatives related to regional development and attractiveness to youths within the Activity Plan. The commission has a broad knowledge and experience of developmental issues among its 10 members, with participation from the important development regions Asia and South America. The IOF Regional Coordinators and the IOF Office Global Development Officer cooperated closely with the commission.

A pilot start-up package for provisional members was created and was used by IOF Regional Coordinators in pilot projects in Egypt and Greece, with good results. The start-up package will continue to be developed and utilized in the next period.

The commission made significant strides in the youth development area. They took over ownership of the youth homepage created in 2014 and have added resource materials regarding school and youth orienteering development in several languages. They have also supported individual members in this area, helping to provide translations of materials.

A number of Erasmus+ projects via the European Union Programme for Education and Training have been successfully applied for and implemented, primarily through the South East Europe Orienteering sub-regional Working Group. The RYDC has taken the experience from these projects and is investigating a wider use of Erasmus+ for development projects in Europe.

World Orienteering Day an overwhelming success

World Orienteering Day was held for the first time ever on May 11th, 2016. The goal was to en-

gage as many orienteering activities as possible across the globe and to have more than 250 000 participants in the activities. A separate webpage was developed www.worldorienteeringday.com which allowed the global activity to be shown and followed on-line. IOC President Thomas Bach wrote a letter expressing his and the IOCs support of World Orienteering Day and the activity was closely followed by the IOC Sports Department.

Finally, 252 927 participants were registered at 2013 worldwide locations in 81 countries and territories. 66 of the IOFs 80 members organised at least one activity as part of World Orienteering Day and in addition activities were organised in 15 countries and territories which are not IOF members today. The activity is therefore very important for regional development. World Orienteering Day was also a very important and successful communications target, particularly in social media.

Membership review process

Since the 2014 General Assembly two new provisional members – Egypt and the Dominican Republic – have joined the IOF, taking the membership to 80, of which 53 are members and 27 provisional members.

Based upon the changes in the IOF Statutes ratified at the General Assembly in 2010, which restricts the length of time which members may have provisional status, a large number of provisional memberships have been reviewed during the last Congress period. The review has included efforts to strengthen a number of the provisional members and to place focus on members who are actively making attempts at developing the sport in their countries. The review has resulted in a number of provisional members becoming members, but also a number of inactive provisional members having their membership status revoked.

Council has also taken actions to activate IOF members who have been delinquent in their membership obligations. This has resulted in the recommendation to terminate the membership for Mongolia.

The final decision on membership status will be ratified at the 2016 General Assembly in Strömstad, Sweden.

The IOF has supported a number of countries where development work is progressing and who can be expected to apply for membership status in the near future. Examples are Albania, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Guatemala, Haiti, Costa Rica, Singapore and the Philippines.

Regional development work

The Asian working group has continued to work for the development of orienteering in the region. A new step was taken in December 2015 with the organization of the first Asian Junior and Youth Championships in Hong Kong. 9 nations participated in the championships. A mapping clinic was held in Chinese Taipei in April 2016. A develop-

ment plan has been initiated for south east Asia as strong local development is happening in Malaysia and Indonesia.

The European member federations decided at their meeting in Scotland in August 2015 to change the working procedures for the European Working Group. It was agreed that the selection and management of the various European Championships should be streamlined with other IOF major events and that the European Working Group should focus its efforts on regional development. In light of these changes, the discipline commissions and IOF Office have modified working processes and taken responsibility for the European Championships events. Rules have been updated in cooperation with the Rules Commission. In terms of the development and expansion of orienteering in the region, considerable progress continues to be made in South East Europe and the Mediterranean area, where the South East European Working Group and the Confederation of Mediterranean Orienteering Federations (COMOF) have provided development support to both current and potential IOF members. A number of development clinics have been conducted by the IOF Regional Coordinator supported jointly by the IOF and the SEEOA. The establishment of further sub-regional groups to help development in existing member federations has begun under the leadership of the European Working Group.

In South America the regional working group has renewed cooperation activities and has established a plan to guarantee the future development and organisation of the South American Orienteering Championships. The group has taken on the task of establishing rules for both senior and youth championships. A regional development clinic including a mapping clinic and an Event Advisers clinic is planned for 2016. The Spanish orienteering federation and the IOF continue to provide vital support to the IOF Regional Coordinator in development projects in both South America and Central America and the Caribbean, and to the Copa Latina sub-regional activities.

In Oceania the co-operation between Australia and New Zealand continues, and in North America between Canada and the United States.

African development has remained challenging, but a very positive development was the membership of Egypt in 2015 assisted by the IOF Regional Coordinator. Activities are well-established in South Africa and thanks to support from the Spanish orienteering federation Mozambique continues to develop.

The IOF currently has appointed and supports five Regional Coordinators to help with practical development work in different regions.

The IOF has, since WOC 2011 in France, organized a development clinic ("WOC clinic") in conjunction with the World Orienteering Championships, together with local organisers. The focus of the

clinic is development of athletes participating at WOC from developing nations. Clinics have been organised in Italy in 2014 with 19 participants from 10 nations and in Scotland in 2015 with 17 participants from 7 nations. The clinic will be organised in Sweden in 2016 with an anticipated 12-15 participants.

The partnership between the IOF, the Swedish Orienteering Federation and the organisers of the O-Ringen orienteering week has continued in support of O-Ringen Academy. O-Ringen Academy in 2014 had 34 participants from 15 nations, and 2015 24 participants from 14 nations.

The development of global events

Efforts to secure a better geographical spread of major IOF events have continued. Orienteering World Cup events were held in Australia in 2015, and the World Masters Orienteering Championships 2017 will be organised in New Zealand. The Ski Orienteering World Cup and World Masters Championships will be organised in the USA in 2018.

In addition, Regional Championships have been strengthened and the South American Championships will be an IOF recognized event for the first time in 2016. In addition to the above mentioned Asian Junior and Youth Championships, Junior and/or Youth Championships will be established in North American, South America and Oceania during 2016 and 2017. These will all be IOF recognized events.

The 2014 General Assembly appointed Latvia organisers of the 2018 World Orienteering Championships and the 2018 World Trail Orienteering Championships. The World MTB Orienteering Championships 2017 were awarded to Lithuania.

During 2015 the IOF Council appointed Portugal as organiser of the 2019 World Trail Orienteering Championships and Austria as organiser of the 2018 World MTB Orienteering Championships. The 2017 World Ski Orienteering Championships were awarded to Russia.

Extraordinary General Assembly to guarantee the viability of the World Orienteering Championships

An Extraordinary General Assembly was held in connection with the 2015 World Orienteering Championships and Presidents Conference in Scotland. On the agenda was a proposal by the Council to organise WOC and Urban WOC in alternating years beginning in 2019. This proposal was aimed at guaranteeing the viability of the Championships, enabling the positive development of the respective formats and adding attraction to global venues. The proposal was approved by the Extraordinary General Assembly. Following the decision Council was able to award Norway the 2019 World Orienteering Championships, and applications were received for the 2020 Urban World Orienteering Championships.

The IOF has, since WOC 2011 in France, organized a development clinic ("WOC clinic") in conjunction with the World Orienteering Championships, together with local organisers. The focus of the

The Competition Review

One of the major projects undertaken during the past activity period was the overall review of the competition schedule and formats in all 4 orienteering disciplines. Council established a working group for this task and the group has done considerable consultation with member federations and expert groups within each discipline regarding the competition schedule. Working together with the respective discipline commissions the working group has made recommendations to Council. The conclusion of this work is to be presented at the General Assembly in 2016.

Anti-doping efforts

In 2014 and 2015 a total of 190 in-competition tests were conducted at major IOF events in foot, MTB and ski orienteering. In addition, out-of-competition testing was carried out both by the IOF and by other signatories of the World Anti-Doping Code on behalf of the IOF. No positive results were reported in any of these tests.

The IOF successfully revised its anti-doping rules to be compliant with the new World Anti-Doping Code that came into effect on 1st January 2015. As the 2015 Code places an increased focus on smart testing, including increased out-of-competition testing and the use of Athlete Biological Passports, a new structure has been put in place for the financing of Anti-doping testing as of January 1, 2016. Here costs are shared by organizers,

participating athletes via the new Athletes Licence and the IOF. The Athletes Licence establishes a secure basis for fair-play between athletes not only regarding anti-doping but all IOF rules.

During 2016 the IOFs Anti-doping strategy and testing plan has been reviewed and revised to maintain compliance to the Anti-doping Code and protect the sport and our clean athletes. The strategy includes a focus on values based education. With the creation of the anti-doping fund a new process for anti-doping management has also been introduced. This method lessens the burden on member federations and organisers in the ordering and management of tests as this is now done exclusively by the Anti-doping officer. It also improves the management of test results.

Partnerships for global presence

The IOF is recognised by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and is a member of SportAccord, the Association of IOC Recognised International Sports Federations (ARISF), the International World Games Association (IWGA), and the International Masters Games Association (IMGA).

The IOF has always had very good relations with the International Military Sports Council (CISM), and this relationship continues to strengthen through orienteering in CISM championships events and multisport events.

The IOF has also continued to develop the excellent relationship with the International University Sports Federation (FISU). In February 2016, the first ever World University Ski Orienteering Championships were held in Tula, Russia. The organisation of the event, in cooperation between FISU and the IOF, was outstanding and was an important step on the path to the Winter Universiade in Krasnoyarsk, Russia in 2019. Discussions about inclusion of orienteering in the FISU Summer Universiade have also been initiated.

Based upon the IOC Agenda 2020, the IOF was invited by the organizers of the Tokyo Olympiad 2020 to apply for the inclusion of orienteering. The IOF submitted an application but was informed that orienteering was not short-listed for inclusion in 2020. The application process did however demonstrate the IOC commitment to considering new sports and events for future games. The IOF has informed the IOC about its interest in seeking the inclusion of ski orienteering in the 2022 winter games.

During the Congress period 2014–2016, IOF representatives have attended international conferences and seminars organised by multi-sports bodies, such as the yearly SportAccord Convention, the SportAccord IF Forum, World Conference on Doping in Sport, General Assemblies of the IWGA, the IMGA, SportAccord and ARISF. IOF representatives have continued to be invited to attend the World University Orienteering Championships and the World Military Orienteering Championships.

Orienteering is once again included in the 10th World Games to be held in Wroclaw, Poland in July 2017. IOF representatives are involved in the preparation of the event and several visits have been made to Wroclaw to plan and assess progress. An important step was taken when the 1st round of the World Cup in orienteering was organized in May 2016 in Wroclaw. This is an important pre-event to the World Games.

Orienteering was an official sport on the programme of the CISM Military World Games held in South Korea in 2015. Ski orienteering was accepted onto the programme of the Military World Ski Championships to be held in Russia in 2017.

Communications and efforts to increase visibility

The IOF Communication Policy and Guidelines was updated in early 2016. This is followed by a Communications Strategy and Plan.

With the aim of raising the profile of orienteering and the IOF on the international sports scene, the IOF has continued to have an exhibition booth at the SportAccord Conventions held in 2015 and 2016. The SportAccord Convention provides a unique networking environment, and the IOF booth significantly helped in promoting orienteering to the convention delegates. In 2016 the IOF also increased its presence at SportAccord by organising a morning orienteering activity to showcase the sport and the modern technology used in orienteering. This effort, and media activities centered around World Orienteering Day, significantly raised the profile of "the up and coming, trend sport" orienteering.

TV and Arena productions project

TV and arena productions from the 2014 and 2015 World Orienteering Championships were successfully delivered to broadcasters. In 2015 broadcasters in 11 different countries took productions from the World Orienteering Championships with 4 countries showing live broadcasts, the remainder showing highlights programs. For 2016, an additional 88 countries are currently scheduled to show highlights from the World Orienteering Championships. The sale of WOC broadcasting rights has significantly increased to slightly more than 100 kEUR in 2015.

High-quality TV broadcasts were also delivered from the World MTB Orienteering Championships in the Czech Republic in 2015 and TV productions were produced and successfully distributed to further countries from the Orienteering World Cup finals in Switzerland in 2015 and World Cup round 1 2016 in Poland.

IOF LiveCenter

At the World Orienteering Championships in 2014 in Italy the IOF LiveCenter was introduced as a platform for internet live-streaming of the TV production and GPS tracking to countries not showing the event on live television. In 2015 IOF LiveCenter was used for all rounds of the Orien-

teering World Cup and the World Orienteering Championships, the European and World MTB Orienteering Championships and the World Ski Orienteering Championships. In 2016 LiveCenter use has continued to increase to further events. LiveCenter has also successfully been used by Jukola 2015 and 2016, Tiomila 2016 and O-Ringen, and it is the intent to further open LiveCenter as a platform for livestreaming of orienteering events internationally.

In connection with the World Orienteering Championships LiveCenter has been a ticketed service, generating important income to organisers and the IOF to offset the cost of productions.

During 2016 a project was started to define the development of the next version of LiveCenter to improve functionality and increase use under the working title Orienteering Channel. The intent is that Orienteering Channel will become the main external communication platform for the IOF.

Publications

In 2014 and 2015 the IOF published the magazine Orienteering World, the Scientific Journal of Orienteering annually and the online magazine Inside Orienteering six times a year. While the target audience for Orienteering World is the international sporting world in addition to orienteers, Inside Orienteering is specifically aimed at orienteers. It provides information about recent developments in the IOF and in orienteering, at a deeper level than the IOF website. In 2016 it was decided to move away from the online publishing platform of Inside Orienteering and instead move to a more frequently published IOF digital Newsletter. The Newsletter goes to 2400 e-mail addresses and subscriptions have increased by approximately 20%.

Social media

The IOF Facebook page has grown more than 100% since 2014 to over 4500 fans, the IOF Twitter account to over 3100 followers and Instagram account to over 2400 followers. Social media is integrated in the communications plan with the IOF website and the IOF newsletter to gain as good coverage as possible. The IOF follows and is followed by all major sports organisations. The IOF also has a YouTube channel which contains highlights of many of the productions done at IOF events as well as specific content.

Strengthening of the Professional organisation

During 2015, Council tasked the newly appointed Secretary General/CEO with reviewing the IOFs professional organisation and suggesting ways of strengthening the organisation in accordance with the strategic and activity plans. Decisions were made to strengthen the Office organisation in the areas of marketing and sponsorship sales, in communications and global development and in IT support. A decision was also made to move the IOF Office from Helsinki, Finland to Karlstad, Sweden to enable a better cost structure and more effectively utilize the resources in place in the


IT support tools and IOF Eventor

In December 2014, the IOF Eventor system was opened for use. The functions of the system include, amongst others: a register of all IOF Athletes and their results and rankings; a register of all IOF member federations; application system for World Ranking Events; IOF Event Calendar; and an entry system for IOF Events. The system was fully operational for all 2015 events including World Ranking events and has improved the updating of the new World Ranking System and the retaining of all results. During 2015 and 2016 improvements to the system were introduced for improved import and export from the system, improved accreditation handling, improvements for use for World Masters events and for the handling of Athlete's licences. The interface to the World Ranking System has also been improved.

Strong commissions improve quality

The IOF Discipline Commissions for FootO, MTBO, SkiO and TrailO have all worked extensively with their respective common remits in the areas of evaluating applications and recommending organisers to Council. They have also worked with event quality through Event Adviser Development and appointments, following up individual organisers progress reports and updating guidelines documents. All discipline commissions have been involved in the competition review project.

The FootO Commission has done extensive analysis and recommendation work for Council regarding the competition review project, both regarding qualification methods and competition formats in the revised competition structure. They have also done preparatory work regarding regional events as this now comes into discipline commission responsibility. The FootO Commission has established a coaches' reference group as a channel for discussion and evaluation.

The MTBO Commission has worked with updating the map standard for MTBO and has also initiated a project for strategic global development, i.e. getting more IOF member federations involved in MTBO. Among the activities conducted was a successful development fund supported MTBO tour of North America in 2015.

The SkiO Commission has initiated a strategic development project under the title Project 2020. A lot of coordination work is done also with other multi-sport games organisations with the ultimate focus being potential inclusion in the 2022 Winter Olympic Games.

The TrailO Commission has revised the team competition format at international championships replacing the current format with a relay competition.

The Rules Commission has worked closely with the four discipline commissions on revisions to their rules. New rules versions came into force in January 2016 for foot, MTB and trail orienteering and in November 2015 for ski orienteering.

The Medical Commission has supported the IOF Anti-doping and Paralympics eligibility processes. The Environment Commission has floundered primarily due to lacking manpower but a new chair

of discipline commissions on the approval of punching systems. This work has been intensified by the final approval process for contact-less punching systems and is now completed. The Rules Commission has also initiated three new projects, one being the rules revisions required for the new regional championships structure. The second project is a revision of the IOF Control Descriptions and third is a review of the overall rules structure to find opportunities for simplification and harmonisation, and to add necessary structure for good governance.

In the Map Commission the work on the ISOM revision project continues and is nearing completion. Work on the Map Color, Generalisation and PrintTech projects continues. Assistance has been provided to Event Advisers for World Championships and the commission has also dealt with requests for rules deviations relating to maps for major IOF events. The Map Commission has evaluated maps made available from major IOF events and WRE events in all disciplines.

The IT Commission has given support in knowledge transfer in connection with the High Level Event Seminar and the punching system approval process. During 2015 a major project was initiated to review the IT quality requirements for IOF major events and produce guidelines for organisers. The project resulted in a set of recommendations to Council relative to improving IT quality and reliability.

The Medical Commission has supported the IOF Anti-doping and Paralympics eligibility processes.

The Environment Commission has floundered primarily due to lacking manpower but a new chair

of the commission has been appointed and has started rejuvenating the commission's work.

All four IOF disciplines have an Athletes' Commission, providing the discipline commissions and Council with advice on matters relating to elite orienteering.

Educational seminars and conferences

The yearly High Level Event Seminar targets both appointed and potential future organisers as well as already licensed Senior Event Advisers and Event Advisers. The Foot Orienteering Commission took on the organisation of the seminar in 2015 which was held in Tallinn, Estonia. Latvia hosted the 2016 seminar with a growing number of participants both times again with the Foot Orienteering Commission responsible for the program. The program of the seminar has been very well received by participants and has become a very important event for knowledge sharing among organisers and event advisers.

Seminars for the licensing of event advisers in foot orienteering have been held in Czech Republic, Switzerland, Denmark and Estonia. Seminars for event advisers in MTB orienteering were held in the Czech Republic, Portugal and Lithuania. Seminars for event advisers in ski orienteering were held in Norway and Austria, and seminars for event advisers in trail orienteering were held in Sweden and Croatia.

The 16th International Conference on Orienteering Mapping was held in conjunction with the 2014 World Orienteering Championships in Lausanne, Switzerland. The programme focused on laser scanning data. The 17th International Conference on Orienteering Mapping is to be held in Strömstad, Sweden in 2016.

Management and finance

At the XXVIII General Assembly in conjunction with the World Orienteering Championships 2014 in Lavarone, Italy, IOF President Brian Porteous was re-elected. He had been President since 2012. The Council saw only one other change, with Council member Mikko Salonen (FIN) elected in place of Timo Ritakallio (FIN) who resigned from the Council.

The Presidents' Conference convened in conjunction with the 2015 World Orienteering Championships in Inverness, Scotland, UK. In connection with the Presidents' Conference the Extraordinary General Assembly was convened, see above. Altogether 106 participants attended the meeting held on 6 August 2015. The main topics on the Presidents' Conference agenda were the status of the Competition Review project, the Athletes Licence and new method of Anti-doping funding, Global development, the Regional and Youth Development Commissions role and the new professional organisation of the IOF.

During the past Congress period, the IOF Council has convened ten times. The meetings have been

held in Lavarone, Italy; Copenhagen, Denmark; Frankfurt, Germany; Istanbul, Turkey; Inverness, Scotland, UK; Vienna, Austria; Malmö, Sweden; Warsaw, Poland; Budapest, Hungary and Strömstad, Sweden. On behalf of the Council, the Event Supervisory Board (ESB) took a total of 75 decisions relating to rules deviations and other event related matters. The decisions made by the ESB have been noted in, and regarded as part of, the minutes of the subsequent Council meeting.

The IOF has five members of staff, equivalent to 4.5 full-time positions. Three employees, namely the Secretary General, the Sports Administrator and the Office Administrator/Anti-doping Officer, are based at the Office in Karlstad, Sweden. The Global Development and Communications Officer and a Marketing/Sales Manager (50%) are based in Falun, Sweden. In addition to the employees of the IOF part-time service contracts are in place with a Marketing/Sales Manager based in Norway, the WOC SEA, based in Norway and an IT support professional in Sweden. These are together the equivalent of 0.9 positions.

Focus has been placed on gaining external income to the IOF via the Marketing and Sales Managers. A new sponsorship structure and products definition has been created and begun to be sold in a structured manner. The structure also takes into consideration cooperation with IOF Event organisers to assist in meeting their financial targets.

In 2015 Nokian Tyres became naming sponsor for the World Orienteering Championships, and additional sponsorship agreements have been signed with BML Printers, EMIT and Silva. In additional external funding has been gained through TV income and through sales of advertising and services in the IOFs IT systems.

The International Olympic Committee (IOC) has continued its yearly financial subsidy to the recognised international sports federations of 25,000 US dollars, and has provided a yearly development grant which is distributed to the recognised federations by ARISF.

In connection with the move of the IOF Office to Karlstad, Sweden that municipality has provided services and funding based upon reciprocal marketing and activities.

The 2014 surplus was 9,602 EUR more than budgeted. As at 1st January 2014 the IOF's own capital was 87,194 EUR, and the 2014 surplus further increased the capital to a total of 134,496 EUR. The 2015 deficit of 19,866 EUR was primarily driven by one-time costs associated with the change of Secretary General restructuring of the IOF Office. As at 1st January 2016, the IOFs own capital was 114,630 EUR.

The 2016 budget has been revised to reflect the present situation. Major changes are due to the increase in TV revenues and costs, increases in IT system costs and the new anti-doping fund.
